Character Roles



Rum Tum Tugger – Male Baritone

Rock Star Cat, flirtatious, pelvis-shaker, loved by the ladies. A bit of a playboy. His temperament swings between clownish and serious. Has a rough street rock voice and wild comedic sexuality.

Old Deuteronomy – Male High Baritone/Tenor (to G sharp)

The lovable patriarch of the Jellicle Tribe, with an air of authority, wisdom, humility and dignity, can express age. He has been around for a very long time.

Munkustrap - Male Baritone/Tenor

An excellent singer and actor who moves very well, Tom is the leader and protector of the Jellicle tribe. As the tribe's storyteller, he also narrates "The Pekes and the Pollicles."

Grizabella – Female Mezzo (to D flat)

Strong singer-actress with a powerful high belt. Having lost her sparkle, this former Glamour Cat now only craves acceptance. She is reborn after being chosen to ascend to the "Heaviside Layer".

Mungojerrie - Male Baritone

Rumpleteazer and Mungojerrie are notorious " cat burglars." They are cheeky, irreverent, and full of youthful energy. They are excellent acrobatic dancers with strong voices and truckloads of personality.

Rumpleteazer - Female Alto

The female half of the pair of notorious "cat-burglars" is cheeky, irreverent, and full of youthful energy. Excellent acrobatic dancers, strong voices and truck-loads of personality.

Gus (Asparagus) - Male Baritone

A smaller role, "The Theatre Cat" is an older cat who has been part of the theatre for many years and who has many stories to tell.

Tantomile – Female Alto

The witch's cat, female twin of Coricopat. Both are perceived as intuitive, even psychic. (Dancing is intense).

Coricopat – Male Baritone

Male twin to Tantomile. Both are intuitive or even psychic. (Dancing is intense).

Growltiger - Male Baritone

A theatrical character who Gus once played in his youth and who appears in Gus' memory of the production of "Growltiger's Last Stand".

Skimbleshanks – Male Tenor

The railway cat who is fastidious and ordered. He lives on the trains and acts as an unofficial chaperone. Obsessed with punctuality and cleanliness.

Sillabub/Jemima – Female Soprano

(Sillabub is the Broadway version's Jemima.) Dancing is intense.

Alonzo – Male Baritone

A black and white tom who is often considered the 'second-hand-man' to Munkustrap.

Bombalurina – Female Mezzo

A lightly sexual female cat who is often considered as the leader of the female "queen" cats.

Demeter - Female Mezzo Soprano

A close friend with Bombalurina, somewhat neurotic and skittish.

Jennyanydots - Female Mezzo

The old Gumbie cat - a motherly character who sits and rules the mice by day and the cockroaches at night. Good comic role. Tap dance is an advantage.

Cassandra – Female Soprano

A mysterious, brown and cream Burmese. One of a kind.

Carbucketty – Male Tenor

The name was one of T.S. Eliot's ideas for cat names for a "knockabout cat".

Mistoffelees - Male Baritone

The magician cat is impish and exudes a huge personality. Strong ballet skills are required of this excellent dancer.

Bustopher Jones - Male Baritone

A fat cat, a '25 pounder.' Snappy dresser (tuxedo and spats), upper class "St James' Street Cat" who is respected by all.

Macavity - Male baritone

This villainous character is a literary allusion to Sherlock Holmes' character, Professor Moriarty. He kidnaps Old Deuteronomy and also attempts to abduct Demeter.

Jellylorum - Female Soprano

The Lillie Cat, named after T.S. Eliot's cat, is a loving female who is protective of the kittens and Jennyanydots. She has a close relationship with Gus.

Victoria – Female Mezzo Soprano The white kitten is extremely gifted in dancing.

Tumblebrutus – Male Baritone

The US counterpart for Bill Bailey. Dancing is intense.

Pouncival - Male Tenor

A playful tom kitten.

Etcetera – Female Mezzo

A happy, energetic kitten who is a big Rum Tum Tugger fan. Intense dancing.

Griddlebone - Female Alto

A fluffy white Persian cat. Growltiger's lover in "Growltiger's Last Stand".

Plato – Male Baritone

He does a pas de deux with Victoria during the Jellicle ball.

Rumpus Cat – Male Tenor

The great, spiky-haired, brave cat with glowing red eyes is mentioned in "The Awful Battle of the Pekes and Pollicles." He is seen as a heroic figure among the Jellicles.
